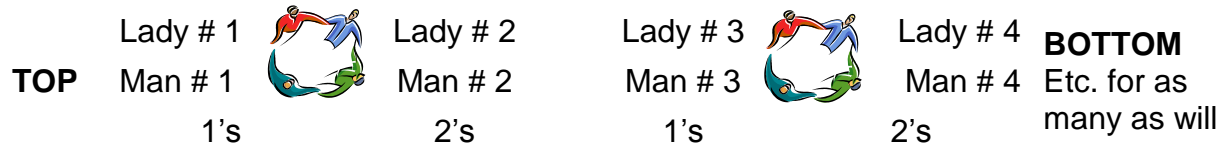


Miss Moore's Rant

Partners line up from top to bottom. Odd numbered couples join hands with the even numbered couple below them to make subsets of two couples thus:



Measure	Count	Figure
A 1-4	8	Odd numbered couples (called #1's) leave their partner and go down the outside of the set, men behind the men's line and ladies behind the ladies' line.
5-8	8	#1's return to places retracing their steps.
A 9-12	8	#1's and #2's take right hands across to make a star and dance forward turning the star clockwise.
13-16	8	#1's and #2's turn about clockwise, give left hands across to form a star and return home.
B 9-12	8	#1 Men and #1 Ladies change places passing right shoulders and go down the outside of the set into the #2's place while the #2's dance up into the #1 's position
13-16	8	#1's join both hands and circle (swing) once and a half around on the spot ending with the men on the men's side and the ladies on the ladies' side (proper). The two couples are now "progressed" one place, i.e. #1's down the set one place and #2's up the set one place.
B 9-16	16	"Rights and Lefts;" Both couples give right hand to their partner as they pass each other by the right shoulder (4 counts), turning the closest way to face the neighbor of the same gender give left hand to the neighbor as they pass each other by the left shoulder (4 counts), partners then give right hand again and pass by (4 counts), and finally give neighbors left hand and pass by to complete the tour around the small square and ending in progressed place.

The dance is now repeated with each #1 couple dancing with the new #2 couple positioned below them. There will be no one for the #2 couple at the top of the set to dance with nor will there be anyone at the bottom for the #1 couple at the end. These two couples wait out one sequence of the dance and prepare to reenter the next round but having changed their number! As other couples reach either end after repetition, they also must wait out one sequence and reenter but having changed from odd to even or even to odd. The dance may be repeated until all couples are back in their original places.
